marginalization, as well as disparities, vulnerability and inequalities in access, participation and retention in the school system.

With a predominantly young population, Africa has a real comparative advantage to transform its economy and develop in a sustainable manner. Maximizing this advantage requires increasing the number of skilled Africans, especially when it comes to technical and vocational skills, necessary to access decent work and entrepreneurship. We will pay particular attention to girls' education, as it is not only a human right, but also a parity and gender equality booster.

The other priority of our action will be to use education, science, technology and innovation as an effective tool to respond to the critical priorities of the continent, such as hunger eradication, the achievement of food security, poverty and inequality reduction, the increase in the productivity of continental resources, environment protection, the development of renewable energies, disease prevention and the management of health crises or natural disasters.

The Covid-19 pandemic and its ensuing crisis has highlighted the important role that ICTs can play in replacing the disruption of face-to-face services. This is true *inter alia* for distance education and training, telemedicine and telework. Accordingly, we will advocate for and support the implementation of the flagship Pan African Virtual and Electronic University (PAVeU) project, which is likely to improve access to tertiary and continuing education in Africa and accelerate the development of human capital, science, technology and innovation

Developing a pan-African accreditation system for education, higher education and training is also a priority. Within this framework, we will provide the Pan-African University with all the means to enable it to play its role as a reference university and to contribute to the strengthening of higher education and scientific research.

We will also support research and development and innovation, in particular by advocating for the achievement of the objective of allocating one (1) percent of the GDP of each member state to research and development.

Our efforts will also be directed towards increasing access to information and communication technologies and ensuring that all African citizens have access to the Internet.

Cooperation and partnership are likely to accelerate the achievement of these goals. In this context, we will encourage scholarship programs among Member States and with foreign partners. Priority will be given to vocational training, IT, technical, scientific and engineering studies.

In collaboration with our foreign partners and the African Diaspora, we will launch new cooperation programs and strengthen existing ones, such as the University Mobility Program in Africa.

Having completed my doctorate in medicine, I was very early, and for twenty-one years without interruption (1976-1997), involved in the training of medical and para-medical staff and later, managers of health structures. I worked in hospitals as well as in primary health care units; this fed my reflections and my conviction that the performance of health systems and the quality of care are intimately linked to the education and basic training of personnel, for which I have never ceased to campaign.

With the WHO, I had the privilege of broadening my field of intervention and my overall vision to a more "macro" level, realizing that at the basis of all progress, there is certainly education, but also science and the mastery and use of technologies. This is what motivated me to co-author, with colleagues from the African Federation for Health Technology (AFHT), a document on the management of health technologies (2001, see publications section below).

I took advantage of my being in various WHO country offices to strive to modernize internal management, relying particularly on the generalization of ICT use.

My time at the UNDP, during the transition period in Tunisia, has been an eye-opener to the field of sustainable development, to the necessary coordination/collaboration between partners, especially in times of crisis. I was able to measure the power and the benefits (time, transparency, clarity of procedures) of the integrated computer management tool set up by the UNDP for the entire organization, but also the gap that remains to be filled in terms of infrastructure and equipment for effective connectivity in our countries.

My background has given me experience in working in multicultural environments, under pressure from crises or deadlines. I have developed a strong sense of teamwork and accountability.

Scrupulously respectful of the ethical principles of international functions, I would put all my capacities at the disposal of the African Union, and through it, of our peoples, with an enthusiastic commitment, if elected.
