#### I. INTRODUCTION


**1.** This report is submitted in compliance with Decision [Assembly/AU/Dec.318 (XV)], adopted by the 15<sup>th</sup> Ordinary Session of the Assembly held in Kampala, Uganda in July 2010, and in line with the Conclusions of the PRC/Commission Retreat held from 31<sup>st</sup> March to 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2011, in Nazareth, Ethiopia, requesting the Commission to submit a Report on the implementation of previous Decisions of the Executive Council and the Assembly, which gives an account of actions taken and challenges encountered. The total number of Decisions being reported on by the Commission is forty (40), of which 22 are Executive Council and seventeen (18) are Assembly. It should be noted that the bulk of the Decisions are those which were not implemented or partially implemented during the June 2015 Summit.

**2.** Of the 40 decisions, three (3) were fully implemented, Thirty (30) were partially implemented, and seven (7) were not implemented The graphs below show the increasing statistical trend in numbers of decisions adopted by AU policy organs with challenges linked with their implementation over the past 4 years (2012-2015).

#### II. General observations

#### a) Increasing statistical trend in numbers of decisions

**3.** A total number of 464 decisions were taken within the last 4 years (2012-2015) with an average of over 30 decisions adopted by both the Executive Council and Assembly. The increasing number of decisions taken led to an increasing number of decisions was being partially implemented or not implemented at all. Six months period, compounded with late release of funds does not give both Member States, the Commission and other AU Organs adequate time to implement the decisions of the Policy organs.

**4.** Noted equally is the increase in the number of Executive Council decisions over Assembly. Attempts are being made to reduce the number of decisions taken at each session of the Summit. The Commission will undertake a study with more focus on reasons leading to the non-implementation of the Decisions of the Policy Organs by all stakeholders as well as proposing measures to address those Challenges.


#### a) The Implementation of decisions

**5.** The analysis of 2015 status of implementation of Decisions shows that out of 105 decisions adopted both in January and July 2015, only 5 decisions were reported fully implemented and over 90 decisions reported as either partially implemented or unaccounted for by departments.

**6.** To address the low levels or non-implementation of policy organs, measures are being undertaken by the Commission to review the implementation processes of previous decisions adopted by the Executive Council and the Assembly. Report.

#### b) Constraints in the implementation of decisions

7. The general constraints cited by various departments are lack of funding, late release of funds and lack of human resources to carry out their activities. Statistical observations on the common challenges faced by respective Departments of the Commission in the process of implementing decisions within their areas of responsibilities is shown in Graph 2 below.

**8.** Other cross-cutting challenges observed were the non-ratification of policies, delayed responses from cooperating partners and Member States.,

#### c) Recommendations and way forward:

- Draft Decisions should be tailored around issues rather than reports as is the practice;
- Departments should strive to reduce their decisions to a minimum of three decisions per department and should ensure their fully implementation within the reporting period;
- Decisions should be reported once a year to provide adequate time for implementation by both the Commission and Member States and be reported during the June/July Summits;
- Adequate financial resources be put at the disposal of the Commission take up its responsibility in the implementation of decisions with full engagement of Member States Administration to speed up recruitment processes in order to address the human resources challenges.
