The General Conference,

Considering the role and contribution of the African languages in education,

Considering the commitment made by the international community to education for all (EFA) in the Dakar Framework for Action,

Considering the Decade for African Education 1997-2006,

Considering the decision taken by the Heads of State at the 37th OAU Summit held at Lusaka, to establish the African Languages Academy and to support its activities,

Aware of the need to promote the African languages so as to ensure their use in all fields of development,

Aware of the role of African language teaching in improving the quality of education,

Welcoming the innovative experiments which have taken place in the use of African languages in education in general and in basic education in particular,

<u>Thanks</u> the Member States and UNESCO for their interest in and support for the project to establish the Academy since the idea was launched;

<u>Invites</u> the Member States to make technical and material contributions to the functioning of the Academy and to the linguistic research and other activities of the Academy;

<u>Invites</u> the Director-General of UNESCO to incorporate the conclusions of the African consultation for the approval of the African Languages Academy project in the Organization's Medium-Term Strategy for 2002-2007, and to allocate the necessary human and financial resources for carrying out the Academy's activities, starting with document 31 C/5;

<u>Decides</u> to allocate an amount of US \$1,000,000 for this project in the 2002-2003 biennium, drawn from the regular resources for Major Programmes I and IV and from extrabudgetary resources.

Explanatory note

In view of the political determination to promote the African languages which has been demonstrated on several occasions throughout the African continent, Mali considers it necessary to propose establishing an instrument giving practical expression to that political will: the African Languages Academy.

As a pan-African organization, the African Languages Academy is intended to be a scientific institution which places its resources, skills and expertise in the service of States, institutions and private bodies, organizations in civil society and cultural and professional associations with a view to achieving the following aims:

- promoting a scientific and democratic culture through the use of African languages, in association with other languages, as a means of education, training, information, sensitization, mobilization and power management;
- strengthening linguistic cooperation between States;

- promoting African languages in general and trans-frontier vehicular languages in particular;
- promoting African languages at international level;
- African integration as an instrument of mutual understanding, peace and conflict prevention.

This draft resolution will give expression to the interest shown by UNESCO in the creation of the African Languages Academy.
