I. INTRODUCTION

This report is submitted in compliance with Decision [Assembly/AU/Dec.318 (XV)], adopted by the 15th Ordinary Session of the Assembly held in Kampala, Uganda in July 2010, and in line with the Conclusions of the PRC/Commission Retreat held from 31st March to 2nd April 2011, in Nazareth, Ethiopia, requesting the Commission to submit a Report on the implementation of previous Decisions of the Executive Council and the Assembly, which gives an account of actions taken and challenges encountered. The total number of Decisions being reported on by the Commission is one hundred three **(103)**, of which fifty five **(56)** are Executive Council and forty nine **(47)** are Assembly. It should be noted that the bulk of the Decisions are those which were not implemented or partially implemented during the January 2016 Summit, including those which were to be reported in July 2016 and January 2017 Summits.
