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**REPORT ON ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF TWO (2) JUDGES OF
THE AFRICAN COURT ON HUMAN AND PEOPLES' RIGHTS**

REPORT ON ELECTION AND APPOINTMENT OF TWO (2) JUDGES OF THE AFRICAN COURT ON HUMAN AND PEOPLES' RIGHTS

1. The elections of the Judges of the African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights (AfCHPR) are based on the provisions of the Protocol to the African Charter on Human and Peoples' Rights on the establishment of an African Court on Human and Peoples' Rights (the Protocol) adopted in 1998 and the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Council.

2. Article 11 of the Protocol provides that the African Court shall be composed of eleven (11) Judges who should be jurists of high moral character and of recognized practical, judicial, or academic competence and experience in the field of human and peoples' rights.

3. Further, Article 11 of the Protocol provides that no two (2) Judges should be nationals of the same State.

4. Article 15(1) of the Protocol provides that the judges of the Court shall be elected for a period of six (6) years and may be re-elected only once.

5. The Commission has the honor to inform the Executive Council that the terms of office of the following two (2) Judges of the AfCHPR shall expire in July 2022:

- i) Ms. Marie-Theresa MUKAMULISA (Rwanda; occupying the floating seat)*
- ii) Ms. Ntyam ONDO MENGUE (Cameroon)*

*Both Judges are eligible for re-election.

Modalities for Election

6. Article 14 of the Protocol provides that the Assembly should ensure that in the Court as a whole, there is representation of the main regions of Africa and of their principal legal traditions (Civil Law, Common Law, Islamic Law and Custom and African Customary Law). In addition, Council should ensure that there is adequate gender representation.

7. Further, the Commission would like to draw the attention of all Member States to Decision EX.CL/907 (XXVIII) on the Modalities on Implementation of Criteria for Equitable Geographical and Gender Representation in the African Union Organs, adopted by the Executive Council in Addis Ababa, in January 2016. Paragraph 2 of the said Decision provides as follows:

- i) The regional representation, where applicable, shall be East (2), Central (2), North (2), South (2) and West (2), except in cases in which a region which has been duly informed has not presented candidates;

- ii) Where applicable, one (1) seat shall be a floating seat and will rotate among the five (5) regions;
- iii) At least one (1) member from each region should be a woman;
- iv) The modalities shall become effective immediately.

8. In light of the above the Commission would like to inform the Council that the regional and gender representation at the AfCHPR after the end of the terms of office of the two (2) judges will be as follows:

9. In this regard, during these elections, in accordance with the Modalities on Implementation of Criteria for Equitable Geographical and Gender Representation in the African Union Organs, the following Judges shall be elected:

- i) **Central Region:** One (1) Female Candidate, and
- ii) **Any Region:** One (1) Female or Male Candidate.

Submission of Candidates

10. The Commission, through its Note Verbal reference number BC/OLC/66.5/12036.22 dated 30 March 2022 invited States Parties to the Protocol to submit candidatures on or before the deadline on 31 May 2022.

11. The Commission would like to inform the Executive Council that the candidatures received from States Parties to the Protocol are as follows:

12. It will be recalled that the Assembly vide Decision **Assembly/AU/Dec.760 (XXXIII)** adopted in February 2020 in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia delegated its authority of appointment of members of AU Organs and institutions, including the AfCHPR, to the Executive Council.

13. In this regard the elected judges shall automatically and simultaneously be appointed by the Council.
