Final Communiqué of the Extraordinary Session of the African Commission on Human and Peoples Rights

1. The African Commission on Human and Peoples Rights held its Extraordinary Session, from 20 to 29 July 2011 in Kigali, Rwanda.
2. The Session was convened to deal with commitments outstanding from past Sessions of the Commission.
3. The Chairperson of the Commission, Honourable Kayitesi Zainabo, Sylvie, opened the Session, with the assistance of Honourable Commissioner Béchir Khalifa Ouedraogo as Vice-Chairperson.
4. The Session was attended by the following Commissioners:

5. Honourable Commissioner Yeung Kam John Yeung was absent with apologies.
6. The following activities were held prior to the Extraordinary Session:

7. The Chairperson, Honorable Commissioner Kayitesi Zainab, briefed Members of the Commission on the African Union (AU) Summit, which took place from 20 to 27 June 2014, in Guinea.

8. Additionally, the Chairperson reported meetings and activities which the Bureau attended on the margins of the Summit.

9. The Commission considered and adopted six (6) Communications as follows:

(i) Nine (9) Communications on Salzwedden provisions were granted on four (4) of these Communications. Two communications were deferred awaiting further information.

(ii) Twelve (12) Communications on Admissibility, with one declared admissible, two (2) declared inadmissible and seven deferred for additional information;

(iii) Three (3) Communications on the merits, with one Communication deferred for further information.

(iv) The Commission also considered and adopted one (1) Communication for want of diligent prosecution.

10. Additionally, the Commission provided directions on Working Group Communications had sought guidance.

15. The Commission was briefed by Mr. Christopher Kachiza, from the Strategic Planning Department of the National Commission for Democracy and Good Governance, following which the Commission established linkages with the Commission's strategic planning process.
16. Additionally, the Commission was briefed by representatives from the American Association for the Advancement of Science on the use of geospatial technology in the investigation of human rights violations.
17. The Commission expresses its sincere and profound appreciation to the Government and People of the Republic of Rwanda for the extended hospitality and support extended to the Members of the Commission during the Session.
