**REPORT ON NEW CANDIDATURES FOR ENDORSEMENT**

## REPORT ON NEW CANDIDATURES FOR ENDORSEMENT

1. **Election** as a Member of the Executive Council of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (**UNESCO**) for the period 2021-2025, during the election scheduled for November 2021 in Paris, France, the candidatures of:

- Arab Republic of Egypt.
- Republic of Mauritius.

**NB. Republic of Djibouti, Islamic Republic of Mauritania, United Republic of Tanzania and Kingdom of Morocco have been previously endorsed. The Ministerial Committee has to be advised of the status of all submissions by the Africa Group in Paris in order to take an appropriate decision.**

**UNESCO** is the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization. It seeks to build peace through international cooperation in Education, the Sciences and Culture. In this spirit, **UNESCO** develops educational tools to help people live as global citizens free of hate and intolerance. **UNESCO** works so that each child and citizen has access to quality education. By promoting cultural heritage and the equal dignity of all cultures, **UNESCO** strengthens bonds among nations. **UNESCO** fosters scientific programmes and policies as platforms for development and cooperation. **UNESCO** stands up for freedom of expression, as a fundamental right and a key condition for democracy and development.

The UNESCO Rules and Procedure indicated that the General Conference adopted a system of electoral groups, which was established for the sole purpose of electing the members of the Board. Member States were thus divided into five groups, in accordance with criteria that are not solely geographical. This new system gives each group a certain number of seats, which is readjusted by the General Conference whenever it decides to modify the total number of seats on the Executive Board. In addition, in order to speed up the rotation of seats among nationals of the different Member States, the General Conference decided at the same time that the term of office of the members of the Board would from then onwards be of six years and would not be renewable, whereas previously, since 1952, members had been elected for a four-year term and were re-eligible for a second term. The election of the members of the Executive Board shall be conducted on the basis of the composition of the electoral groups of UNESCO, it being understood that 'Group V' shall consist of two separate groups, (Va) for the African States and (Vb) Arab States respectively. 14 seats for Group Va, and 7 seats for Group Vb. An additional floating seat shall be allocated for Group Va and Vb on a rotational basis.

2. **Election** as Non-Permanent Member of the United Nations Security Council (**UNSC**) for the period 2024-2025, during the election scheduled for June 2023 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- People's Democratic Republic of Algeria (early consideration)

**N/B: Algeria has made a request for early consideration in line with Rule 13. However, early consideration does not foreclose submission of other candidatures.**

**The decision of the Ministerial Committee has to be informed by the advice of the Africa Group in New York, USA.**

**The UN Security Council (UNSC)** has primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security. It has 15 Members, and each Member has one vote. Under the Charter of the United Nations, all Member States are obligated to comply with Council decisions. The Security Council takes the lead in determining the existence of a threat to the peace or act of aggression. It calls upon the parties to a dispute to settle it by peaceful means and recommends methods of adjustment or terms of settlement. In some cases, the Security Council can resort to imposing sanctions or even authorize the use of force to maintain or restore international peace and security.

3. **Election** as a Non-Permanent Member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for the period 2028-2029 (early consideration), during the election scheduled for June 2027 in New York, USA, the candidatures of:

- **Kingdom of Morocco.**
- **State of Libya.**

**N/B: Morocco has made a request for early consideration in line with Rule 13. Libya did not make a request for early consideration in line with Rule 13. Early consideration does not foreclose submission of other candidatures. The decision of the Ministerial Committee has to be informed by the advice of the Africa Group in New York, USA.**

4. **Election** as a Non-Permanent Member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for the period 2022-2023, during the election scheduled for June 11, 2021 in New York, USA, the candidatures of:

- **Gabonese Republic (Central Africa). (Under consultations)**
- **Republic of Ghana (West Africa). Endorsed by the African Group**

**NB: 2 seats are available for Africa for West Africa and Central Africa. The issue regarding the seat allocated to the Central Africa region remains unresolved. The three candidates, Chad, DRC and Gabon have not yet reached consensus on one single candidate.**

5. **Election** as a Non-Permanent Member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for the period 2023-2024 (early consideration), during the election scheduled for June 2022 in New York, USA, the candidatures of:

- **Republic of Mozambique (Southern Africa). Endorsed by the sub-region and the African Group NY.**

6. **Election** as a Non-Permanent Member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) for the period 2025-2026 (early consideration), during the election scheduled for June 2024 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- **Republic of Mauritius.**

**N/B: Mauritius has made a request for early consideration in line with Rule 13. However, early consideration does not foreclose submission of other candidatures. The decision of the Ministerial Committee has to be informed by the advice of the Africa Group in New York, USA.**

7. **Election** as a Member of the United Nations Commission on Narcotic Drugs (**CND**) for the period 2022-2025, during the election scheduled for April/May 2021 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- **Republic of Ghana. Endorsed by the African Group.**

**The Commission on Narcotic Drugs (CND)** was established by Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) resolution 9(I) in 1946, to assist the ECOSOC in supervising the application of the international drug control treaties. In 1991, the General Assembly (GA) expanded the mandate of the CND to enable it to function as the governing body of the UNODC. ECOSOC resolution 1999/30 requested the CND to structure its agenda with two distinct segments: a normative segment for discharging treaty-based and normative functions; and an operational segment for exercising the role as the governing body of UNODC. The CND meets annually when it considers and adopts a range of decisions and resolutions.

8. **Election** as a Director-General of the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (**UNIDO**) for the period 2021-2025, during the election scheduled for June 2021 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- **Dr. Arkebe Oqubay**, of the Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia.

**The United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO)** is a specialized agency of the United Nations that assists countries in economic and industrial development. It is headquartered at the UN Office in Vienna, Austria, with a permanent presence in over 60 countries.

9. **Re-election** as a Member of the UN International Law Commission (**ILC**) for the period 2023-2027, during the election scheduled for June 2022 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- **Prof. Hassan Ouazzani Chahdi**, of the Kingdom of Morocco.
- **Prof. Charles Jallow** of the Republic of Sierra Leone.

**N/B: The decision of the Ministerial Committee has to be informed by the advice of the Africa Group in New York, USA. Further clarification required.**

**The International Law Commission (ILC)** is a body of experts established by the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) on 21 October 1947 by Resolution 174. The statute of the ILC define its purpose as (a) promoting the development and codification of international law; and (b) solving problems within both public and private international

law. It comprises 34 individuals elected every five (5) years by the UNGA on the basis of their recognised competences and qualifications in international law.

- **Arab Republic of Egypt.**

**The International Maritime Organization (IMO)** is a specialised agency of the United Nations responsible for regulating shipping. The IMO was established following agreement at a UN conference held in Geneva in 1948 and the IMO came into existence ten years later, meeting for the first time in 1959.

**11. Election as a Member of the International Maritime Organization (IMO)** under Category "C" for the period 2021-2022, during the election scheduled for September 2020 in London, UK, the candidature of:

- **Republic of Kenya.**

**The International Maritime Organization (IMO)** is a specialised agency of the United Nations responsible for regulating shipping. The IMO was established following agreement at a UN conference held in Geneva in 1948 and the IMO came into existence ten years later, meeting for the first time in 1959. More recently SOLAS has been amended to bring an increased focus on maritime security through the International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) Code. The IMO has also increased its focus on smoke emissions from ships. In January 1959, IMO began to maintain and promote the 1954 OILPOL Convention. Under the guidance of IMO, the convention was amended in 1962, 1969, and 1971.

**12. Election** as a Chair of the International Civil Service Commission (ICSC) for the period 2023-2026, during the election scheduled for June 2022 in New York, USA, the candidatures of:

The election of the Chair is an internal process once the membership of the Commission has been dully constituted.**

**The International Civil Service Commission (ICSC)** is an independent expert body mandated by the UN General Assembly to regulate the conditions of service of staff in the United Nations common system and promote high standards in the international civil service. The Commission is asked either to make decisions itself, on matters such as establishment of daily subsistence allowance and schedules of post adjustment, or to make recommendations to the General Assembly which then acts as the legislator for the rest of the common system. Additionally, the Commission is asked to make recommendations to the executive heads of the organizations on matters such as human resources policy issues.

Countries who have become party to the treaty (States parties) are obliged to submit regular reports to the Committee on how the rights of the Convention are implemented. During its sessions the Committee considers each State party report and addresses its concerns and recommendations to the State party in the form of concluding observations

**14. Election** as a Secretary General of the International Civil Aviation Organization (**ICAO**) for the period 2021-2024, during the election scheduled for March 2021 in Montreal, Quebec, Canada, the candidature of:

- **Mr. Habib Mekki**, of the Republic of Tunisia.

**The International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)** is a specialized agency of the United Nations with its HQs in Montreal, Quebec, Canada. It changes the principles and techniques of international air navigation and fosters the planning and development of international air transport to ensure safe and orderly growth.

**15. Election** as a Member of the Committee on the Elimination Discrimination Against Women (**CEDAW**) for the period 2023-2026, during the election scheduled for June 2022 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- **Ms. Vera NKWATE NGASSA**, of the Republic of Cameroon.

**N/B: Cameroon has made a request for early consideration in line with Rule 13. However, early consideration does not foreclose submission of other candidatures. The decision of the Ministerial Committee has to be informed by the advice from the Africa Group in New York, USA.**

**The Committee on the Elimination of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW)** is a body of independent experts that monitors implementation of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women. The Committee comprises of 23 experts on women's rights from around the world. Countries who have become party to the treaty (States parties) are obliged to submit regular reports to the Committee on how the rights of the Convention are implemented. During its sessions the Committee considers each State party report and addresses its concerns and recommendations to the State party in the form of concluding observations

**16. Election** as a Member of the United Nation Human Right Committee (**HRC**) for the period 2022-2026, during the election scheduled for June 2021 in Geneva, Switzerland, the candidature of:

**The Human Rights Committee (HRC)** is the body of independent experts that monitors implementation of the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights by its State parties. All States parties are obliged to submit regular reports to the Committee on how the rights are being implemented. States must report initially one year after acceding to the Covenant and then whenever the Committee requests (usually every four years). The Committee examines each report and addresses its concerns and recommendations to the State party in the form of "concluding observations".

**17. Election** as a Member of the United Nations Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (**CERD**) for the period 2022-2026, during the election scheduled for June 2021 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- **Ms. ESSENAME Regine**, of the Republic of Cameroon.

**The Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (CERD)** is the body of independent experts that monitors implementation of the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination by its State parties. All States parties are obliged to submit regular reports to the Committee on how the rights are being implemented. States must report initially one year after acceding to the Convention and then every two years. The Committee examines each report and addresses its concerns and recommendations to the State party in the form of "concluding observations".

**18. Election** as a Member of the Administrative Board of the United Nations Children's Fund (**UNICEF**) for the period 2022-2024, during the election scheduled for April/May 2021 in New York, USA, the candidature of:

- **People's Democratic Republic of Algeria. endorsed by African Group**

**UNICEF**, also known as the **United Nations Children's Fund**, is a United Nations agency responsible for providing humanitarian and developmental aid to children worldwide. The agency is among the most widespread and recognizable social welfare organizations in the world, with a presence in 192 countries and territories. **UNICEF's** activities include providing immunizations and disease prevention, administering treatment for children and mothers with HIV, enhancing childhood and maternal nutrition, improving sanitation, promoting education, and providing emergency relief in response to disasters. **UNICEF** is the successor of the **International Children's Emergency Fund (ICEF)**, created in 1946 by the U.N. Relief Rehabilitation Administration to provide immediate relief to children and mothers affected by World War II. The same year, the U.N. General Assembly established the **United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF)** to further institutionalize post-war relief work. In 1950, **UNICEF's** mandate was extended to address the long-term needs of children and women, particularly in developing countries. In 1953, the organization became a permanent part of the United Nations System, and its name was subsequently changed to its current form, though it retains the original acronym.

**The Human Rights Council (HRC)**, formerly, the United Nations Commission on Human Rights, is the UN body whose mission is to promote and protect human rights around the globe. The Council's Membership is based on equitable geographical distribution: 13 seats are reserved for African States (4 seats for Western, 3 seats for Eastern, 2 seats for Central, 2 seats for Southern, 1 seat for Northern, and 1 rotating seat between Southern and Northern regions); 13 for Asia-Pacific States; 8 for Latin America and Caribbean States; 7 for Western Europe and other States; and 6 for Eastern European States.
