

Increasing the use of smart solutions will bring more flexible and connected solutions which in turn will help improve the transmission and distribution lines and help meet energy demand across the Continent. Efficiency - An important component of energy transition and mix improvement is energy efficiency through the work of AFREC.

Clean Cooking - AU plans should drive faster actions to meet energy access goals and to call for an approach to tackle the clean cooking crisis.

3.2 Spurring Digitalisation By increasing productivity and facilitating innovation, technology is a key sector for the economic development. To expedite Africa's economic recovery and resilience the continent will need to accelerate its digital transformation, through the implementation of the harmonised approach of Africa's Digital Transformation Strategy, especially the linkages with sectors as disgital health, education, commerce, identity, financial transfers, the fast tracking of ICT PIDA projects as well as the operationalisation of the Malabo convention and capacity building in terms of cybersecurity and data confidentiality.

3.3 Scaling-Up Smart, Resilient & Inclusive Transport Green and inclusive transport infrastructure can tackle environmental vulnerabilities, produce green jobs and economic opportunities while availing the needed access to services and physically connecting rural and urban areas as well as the economic centres across the Continent.

3.4 Support to Africa's Continental Free Trade Area & Flagship Projects Successful operationalisation AfCFTA will have a profound impact on the continent's infrastructure sectors. The AfCFTA provides an entirely new platform to expand these efforts regionally and pursue infrastructure development to relieve the infrastructure restraint. AfCFTA agreement is also likely to encourage africans to rethink our infrastructure supply chains and look at regional and local supply chains more.

4. Key Considerations

4.1 Gender empowerment Women's and communities' health, wellbeing and socio-economic development are strongly interlinked with equal access to infrastructure and technologies.

4.2 Climate resilient-infrastructure

To increase Africa's resilience, promote quality growth, and speed up efforts to end extreme poverty, investment in resilient infrastructure is fundamental. COVID-19 pandemic has amplified calls for infrastructure to be resilient and adaptable.
