CM 0782 MIGROFICHE Information Note on the International Association of French Speaking Parliamentarians

The International Association of French Speaking Parliamentarians (AIPLF) was established in 1967 on the collective in initiative of Presidents Senghor, Bourghiba, Diori at Luxembourg.

In its objectives defined in article 11 of its Constitution, it aims at "participating in every initiative leading to the defence of French culture in countries which are entirely or partly French speaking".

"It will also participate in very action aiming at developing or acquainting, through the French language, people with the culture and civilization of those who regularly make use the language without belonging to the French culture and civilization."

"The AIPLF intends to constitute among its Parliamentarian members a close cooperation so as to strengthen the solidarity established among them by the use of a common language. The AIPLF has no political aim".

According to article III, all the AIPLF is composed of Parliamentarians grouped in national sections in the Parliaments of the states in which French is the official language, the medium of expressin or the language frequently spoken. Each state is entitled to a single section and decides freely its own constitutions.

"Parliamentarins or rperesentatives of Regional Logislative assemblies originating from a state in which there is no national section, can be admitted either collegiately into an associated section or individually as associate members.

At the last General seembly, Erazil and Eanta Lucia requested the status of national section. The People's Republic of the Congo, Greece, Togo and South Viet-nam were accredited as observers.

The activities of the AIPLF which are predominantly actions of cultural solidarity made it accredited to:

- 4 May 1973, the UNO ECOSOC Group 11
- 11 May 1974, UNESCO
- 25 April 1974, the Council of Europe in 1974, the
- Conference of French speaking Ministers of Education and the many French speaking international organizations.

If the AIPLF improves its relations with its counter parts the <u>UIP</u> and <u>CPA</u>, it entertains, above all, privileged relations with the <u>gence de Coopération Culturelle et Technique</u> (<u>egency of Cultural and Technical Cooperation in accordance with the wishes of its General issembly held in Ottawa and with those of the General Conference of the Agency held in 1971 in Ottawa, reaffirmed in the rotocol of Agreement signed in 1972.</u>

Under these various provisions, meetings of the "Special Committee of the Agency of the Cultural and Technical Cooperation" of the AIPLF examine the work or programme of the Agency, which it contributed to create by its action. so as to familiarize people, with them.

Besides, the AIPLF organizes, in relation with the Agency of the Cultural and Pechnical Cooperation, punctual missions in Member States with a view to examining some of its realisations in matters of education... It is an the occasion of one of these missions that it submitted to the limited nations a report on the drought problems in the Sahel. The result was a commentatory letter of thanks for Mr. Kurt Waldheim, United Nations Secretary-General, recalling that it was the first non governmental organization to make mention of this problem to the Universal Organization and asked it to continue in the same spirit.
