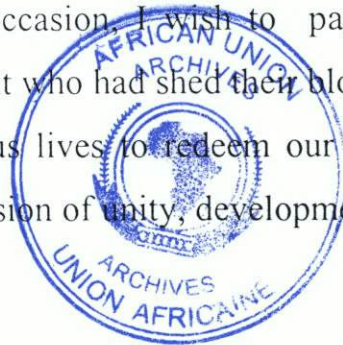

The moment for which our living and fallen heroes have made immense sacrifices; the moment for which many battles were fought and many dreams were nurtured; the moment to reassert our common humanity, regain our collective dignity and forge the eternal bond of unity.

Today, we are realizing the cherished desire of the peoples of this Continent to join together their energies, consolidate their efforts, and create a stronger framework for the collective attainment of a higher horizon. Coincidentally, this year also marks the 90<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of the African National Congress that was at the forefront of the anti-apartheid struggle in South Africa. Each one of us has to work hard and maintain the determination for reaching the milestones. Each one of us has to honour and cherish the values and principles that <sup>bind</sup> keep us together and make us stronger as a people.

I salute you, the people of Africa, for this new dawn that is unfolding in front of us. I salute you, the peoples of South Africa – this birthplace of the Great Madiba, Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela, the living symbol of Africa's struggle for freedom and dignity. The launching of the African Union amongst you brave people of this country is also a reaffirmation of Africa's pride in the triumph of the last battle against oppression that was fought in this land.

Without relenting our pride, zeal and commitment, let us march forward in unity and solidarity, conquer every adversity and gain the final victory. We can do it, there is nothing to stop us. We have done it before!
