# REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PREVIOUS DECISIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL AND THE ASSEMBLY

#### REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF PREVIOUS DECISIONS OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL AND THE ASSEMBLY

This report gives a brief summary of the status of implementation, by the Departments, Directorates and Units of the Commission, of various decisions, declarations and other acts issued by the policy organs of the Union during the review period, that is, from January to June 2006.

The Executive Council and the Conference adopted a significant number of acts sanctioning the deliberations of their various ordinary, extraordinary and special sessions; these acts provide the legal frameworks binding the Commission and other Union organs in the performance of their duties to consolidate the integration process in Africa. Many of these actions are undertaken in the form of consultation meetings, coordination and harmonization of approaches and activities organized in conjunction with Member States. Most often, the aim is to adopt common stands and harmonized political decisions.

The activities cover a wide range and a high number of topics of common interest to Member States. The range stretches from legal, administrative, financial, political, economic, social and cultural issues to peace and security. Certain specific items proposed by Member States are treated in a separate implementation report to be submitted to the Conference for consideration.

On account of budgetary constraints or lack of human resources during the review period, certain decisions with particular financial incidence were not implemented, while others were carried forward a little for technical reasons or because of the schedule, pending more favourable conditions or eased constraints.
