The establishment of the sub-Committee of the PRC to facilitate the coordination between Addis Ababa, Brussels, Geneva and capitals is yet to be established as the draft TOR of the sub-Committee is yet to be finalized by PRC.

### Remarks

Commission has not been able to harmonize the efforts of the concerned RECs and Member States because the Commission is not directly involved in the pre-negotiations consultations and formulation of the Road-Map of the negotiations as the countries deal directly with the European Commission. The Commission does not always get invited to the negotiation meetings.
