**INTRODUCTION**

In accordance with Decision [Assembly/AU/Dec.318 (XV)], adopted by the 15th Ordinary Session of the Assembly held in Kampala, Uganda in July 2010, and in line with the Conclusions of the PRC/Commission Retreat held from 31<sup>st</sup> March to 2<sup>nd</sup> April 2011, in Nazareth, Ethiopia, the Commission is pleased to submit this Report which gives an account of actions taken and challenges encountered in the process of implementation of the various Decisions and Declarations taken by the policy organs of the Union, spanning from the Malabo July 2011 Summit to the January 2012 Summit held in Addis Ababa.

At their various Ordinary, Extraordinary and Special Sessions, the Executive Council and the Assembly of the Union, had adopted a number of decisions, declarations and resolutions at the conclusion of their deliberations, which constitute the legal authority for the Commission, Member States, and the other Organs of the Union to pursue actions necessary for the integration process of the Continent. Many of those actions and activities were carried out in collaboration with Member States, the other AU Organs, stakeholders and partners such as the Regional Economic Communities (RECs), in the form of consultation and coordination meetings aimed at harmonizing actions and viewpoints that would facilitate the adoption of common positions and collective policy decisions by the AU Policy Organs.

The activities carried out during the period under consideration range from legal, administrative, financial, political and peace and security issues to economic, social, scientific and cultural matters and cover various subjects and numerous important issues of interest to Member States and to the continent in general, some of which the reports currently being considered under the Agenda of the Executive Council and/or that of the Assembly are based upon. Furthermore, the statements of the Chairperson of the Commission during the opening of both the Executive Council and the Assembly did give an account of stewardship of actions taken during the last six months, in the implementation of some decisions of the Executive Council and the Assembly. However, despite the remarkable efforts made, it is pertinent to note that the Decisions that have emanated from such noble creative approaches have witnessed difficulties in their implementation.

The report identified 32 Decisions of the Executive Council and 36 Decisions of the Assembly, and has endeavoured to give the current status of their implementation.

In order to present a concise and comprehensible report, the Commission has avoided duplication as much as possible on such Decisions in which detailed and self-

explanatory Reports had been submitted for consideration under the Agenda Items of the present sessions of the Executive Council and Assembly.

**Problems identified in the implementation of the Decisions and Recommendations:**

It is common knowledge that many decisions taken at various sessions of the Executive Council and Assembly have been met with very little degree of implementation. The reasons for the low execution level of the Decisions could be attributable to various factors such as:

- The high number of decisions taken at each Session
- Budgetary, human and Technical constraints
- Quasi dependency on Partners' support
- Short time-frame for reporting

It is also worth highlighting that although majority of the decisions are supposed to be implemented by Member States, feedback by the latter has been very slow.

**Recommendations:**

1. The Commission should ensure compliance with the Guidelines on the preparation and adoption of decisions and the time-frame for implementation as means of stream-lining and further reducing the number of decisions adopted at each Session of the Executive Council and the Assembly.
2. Financial, human and Technical resources should be made available to facilitate the implementation of decisions where these factors have been identified as constituting an impediment.
3. Member States should endeavour to provide and in a timely manner, their inputs to the report on implementation of previous decisions.
4. Proper scrutiny should be made at all levels of the Financial,. Legal, and material implications prior to the adoption of any decision.
